Please share these updates with your staff to support their implementation of the Delta Math Rtl Program.

1. Summer Readiness and Progress Screeners

- Access to online summer screeners will be available if your district representative completes the "Register
 to use Summer Screeners" form on the <u>Contact Us</u> support page. Please complete the registration form by
 May 15, 2024 to provide enough time to process new enrollment data.
- To maximize instructional time during the summer, many schools are using "screening-up" data collected in May to identify unfinished learning that can be supported during summer learning opportunities.

2. 2023-24 Data Availability

- On June 14, the OAISD technology department will save all student results for each standard. On June 15, this data will be available in the <u>Additional Reports</u> for as long as your district participates with the Delta Math RtI Program. To request your district's username and password, complete the form "Help Desk for Current Participants" on the <u>Contact Us</u> support page.
- On June 14, the OAISD technology department will remove all 2023-24 enrollment and student data from the screening and reporting platform to prepare for the 2024-25 school year.

3. Kindergarten Readiness Screeners and Number Sense

- The kindergarten readiness screener is designed as a one-on-one interview. Educators can record student responses directly into the student's online screener, or they can record student responses on paper to transfer into the online screener at a later time.
- The Delta Math RtI Program <u>Number Sense Overview</u> was recently developed to support educators in their understanding of number sense. This document includes visual models that are integrated throughout Delta Math RtI Program intervention lessons and targeted practice. Quick links are also provided to download instructional resources for each number sense readiness standard.
- Progress monitoring for the kindergarten readiness standards is scheduled to be developed this spring and summer. Each standard will be aligned to number sense games listed on page 2 of the Number Sense
 Overview so that progress monitoring data can be collected while observing students at play.

4. Secondary Math Geometry Readiness

- The geometry readiness screeners have been modified throughout this pilot year to reflect feedback we have received from regional math consultants and teachers.
- The next resources to be developed for each geometry readiness standard will include quick checks, growth charts, visual guided practice, and hands-on activities when appropriate. This work will begin during the summer and continue throughout the 2024-25 school year.
